Urban Partnership Coffee Hour at St. George's Today

2024 Nehemiah Action Assembly

Your Cathedral Social Justice Ministry delivered over 50 participants to Louisville's largest community assembly devoted to solving serious community problems. Mayor Greenberg committed to recommend that CLOUT be included in monitoring the DOJ Consent Decree on abuses by LMPD. Superintendent Pollio committed to meet with CLOUT over the next two years to review reading proficiency test scores when they are released.

The roughly 1000 Louisvillians in attendance signed cards asking for establishment of the Louisville Village. This virtual village is not a physical place but is a network of vetted service providers to help seniors age in their own homes. We are now working with a new potential sponsor. Members from throughout the Diocese of Kentucky will meet in Montgomery, AL for a formational journey as we visit the 3 Legacy sites created by the Equal Justice Initiative: The Legacy Museum, The National Memorial for Peace and Justice, and the newest that just opened - The Freedom Monument Sculpture Park.



A local guide and historian will lead us as we visit Hayneville (Jonathan Myrick Daniels Memorial) and Selma (Edmund Pettus Bridge). Applications accepted for United Nations 2024 climate conference Episcopal delegation

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry invites all interested Episcopalians over 18 to apply to be a delegate—in person or virtually—to the 2024 United Nations climate change conference, scheduled for Nov. 11-22 in Baku, Azerbaijan. Applications—found online in English (<https://tinyurl.com/4jnhvmp2>) and Spanish (<https://tinyurl.com/242fdh7u>)—are due by 5 p.m. ET May 6.

Since 2015, Episcopal delegates have attended the Conference of the Parties of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (known as UNFCCC COP), which this year marks its 29th session. The UNFCCC is a multilateral convention adopted in 1992 to help stabilize greenhouse gas emissions. Nearly 200 parties have joined the convention.
