The Louisville City-Wide Book Club will read *One Person, No Vote: How Voter Suppression Is Destroying Our Democracy* by Dr. Carol Anderson during the month of February, culminating with a lecture by the author at St. Matthew's Episcopal Church on Thursday, February 22 at 6:30 PM. Carol Anderson is the Charles Howard Candler Professor of African American Studies at Emory University and author of *White Rage: The Unspoken Truth of Our Racial Divide*, a New York Times Bestseller, Washington Post Notable Book of 2016, and a National Book Critics Circle Award winner. She is also the author of *Eyes Off the Prize: The United Nations and the African American Struggle for Human Rights, 1944-1955*; *Bourgeois Radicals: The NAACP and the Struggle for Colonial Liberation, 1941-1960*, and *One Person, No Vote: How Voter Suppression is Destroying Our Democracy*, which was long-listed for the National Book Award and a finalist for the PEN/ Galbraith Award in non-fiction.
