Louisville Master Chorale Concert

During this season of remembrance and reflection, Louisville Master Chorale offers two works for choir and organ that reflect the power and mystery of sacred texts. Uniting the Chorale with Second Presbyterian's magnificent Casavant Freres organ is Ken Cowen, one of North America's finest concert organists. Praised for his dazzling artistry and impeccable technique, Ken, along with Louisville baritone James Rittenhouse, will join the Chorale in Maurice Durufle's incomparable and virtuosic Requiem. A companion work by English composer Gerald Finzi-Lo, *The Full, Final Sacrifice*-completes the program with its thought-provoking setting of Thomas Aquinas's text.

Several members of the Cathedral choir (Jan Margerum, Randy Peters, Stuart McCloy and Liam O'Daniel-Munger) sing with the Louisville Master Chorale and would love to see you there! The concert will be at Second Presbyterian Church on Sunday March 17 at 3:00 p.m. Tickets

Toward GC81: Registration open for General Convention visitors

Online registration is open for visitors to the 81st General Convention of The Episcopal Church, scheduled for June 23-28 in Louisville, Kentucky. An onsite registration area will also open June 21. Visitor registration fees for the entire convention are \$150 in advance, or \$180 at the site. The cost for day visitors is \$50 per day. Youth ages 12 to 18 will pay \$50 for the whole convention. Access to the exhibit area only is \$20 per day.

Visitor registration fees allow access to all areas of General Convention, including visitor galleries in the House of Bishops and House of Deputies, legislative committee rooms and hearings, the exhibit area, and worship services.

All registrants will be required to show a photo ID and sign a liability waiver and photo release agreement when they pick up their badge at the registration area.

Convención General 81 (CG81): Se abre el plazo de inscripción para los visitantes durante la Convención General

Ya abrió el plazo de inscripción en línea para las personas que desean visitar la 81ª Convención General de la Iglesia Episcopal, prevista a llevarse a cabo del 23 al 28 de junio en Louisville, Kentucky. El 21 de junio también se abrirá un área de inscripción en las instalaciones del evento.

La tarifa de inscripción de visitantes que desean asistir a todos los días de la Convención es 150 dólares si se paga por adelantado, o 180 dólares

si paga en persona durante la Convención. El costo para visitantes es de 50 dólares por día. Los jóvenes de 12 a 18 años pagan 50 dólares por toda la Convención. El acceso sólo al salón de exposiciones cuesta 20 dólares el día.

La tarifa de inscripción para visitantes permite el acceso a todas las áreas de la Convención General, e incluye las galerías para visitantes en la Cámara de Obispos y la Cámara de Diputados, las salas y audiencias de los comités legislativos, el salón de exposiciones y los servicios litúrgicos.

Todas las personas inscritas deben mostrar un documento de identidad con fotografía y firmar un formulario de liberación de responsabilidad y un permiso para dejarse tomar fotografías y videos, en el momento en que recojan su gafete de identificación en el área de inscripción.
