During this season of remembrance and reflection, Louisville Master Chorale offers two works for choir and organ that reflect the power and mystery of sacred texts. Uniting the Chorale with Second Presbyterian's magnificent Casavant Freres organ is Ken Cowen, one of North America's finest concert organists. Praised for his dazzling artistry and impeccable technique, Ken, along with Louisville baritone James Rittenhouse, will join the Chorale in Maurice Durufle's incomparable and virtuosic Requiem. A companion work by English composer Gerald Finzi-Lo, The Full, Final Sacrifice completes the program with its thought-provoking setting of Thomas Aquinas's text.
