Mayor Greenberg Says Yes to CLOUT

The 2024 Nehemiah Action Assembly will be held at Memorial Auditorium on Tuesday, April 16, at 6:30 pm. Doors open at 5:30. Mayor Greenberg has confirmed his attendance to speak to the need for moderated listening sessions between citizens and LMPD. Reconciliation cannot take place until and unless aggrieved parties can express the harm they have suffered at the hands of those sworn to protect them. Listening is an integral piece of the Truth & Transformation process designed to repair police-community relations.

JCPS Superintendent Pollio is sending a representative to speak to CLOUT's demand that phonics instruction be mandated for students in remedial reading classes. The effectiveness of the phonics approach is proven to dramatically increase reading proficiency. When JCPS abandoned phonics, students' reading proficiency plummeted. Today, 64% of JCPS students read below grade level. While JCPS ranks relatively well against other Kentucky systems, it is important to note that the Commonwealth ranks a poor 37th out of the 50 states in reading proficiency. Illiteracy is a gateway into the school-to-prison pipeline.

Be a part of the 1000+ citizen advocates showing our elected officials that we take poor reading proficiency and police-community relations very seriously. Department of Justice to hold community meeting on consent decree

During the Easter season last year, the Cathedral held a series of discussions as we read through the Department of Justice report on Louisville Metro Government and LMPD. The DOJ has recently announced that they will be holding a community meeting on Monday April 8th, 2024, from 6:00pm-7:30pm, at the Republic Bank Foundation YMCA, Community Meeting Room, 1720 West Broadway, Louisville, KY 40203. Their team, who conducted the investigation into the Louisville Metro Police Department, will discuss what consent decrees have done for other cities' police forces, what the decree can do for LMPD, and what opportunities there are for community involvement throughout the implementation and monitoring process here in Louisville. Spanish and ASL interpretation will be provided.
