Dean Emeritus of Canterbury Cathedral to visit Christ Church Cathedral

We are excited to announce an upcoming visit from The Rev. Dr. Robert Willis, Dean Emeritus of Canterbury Cathedral. Dean Willis served as Dean of Canterbury Cathedral for 21 years and previously served as Dean of Hereford Cathedral for 10 years. In recent years, Dean Willis is best known for his beloved daily broadcasts of Morning Prayer from the garden of the Canterbury deanery, a ministry which he continues in his retirement.

Dean Willis will join us for afternoon tea on Saturday, June 8 with a forum discussion on the role of Cathedrals as places of connection throughout the Anglican Communion. We will welcome him as our guest preacher on Sunday, June 9. More details will follow.

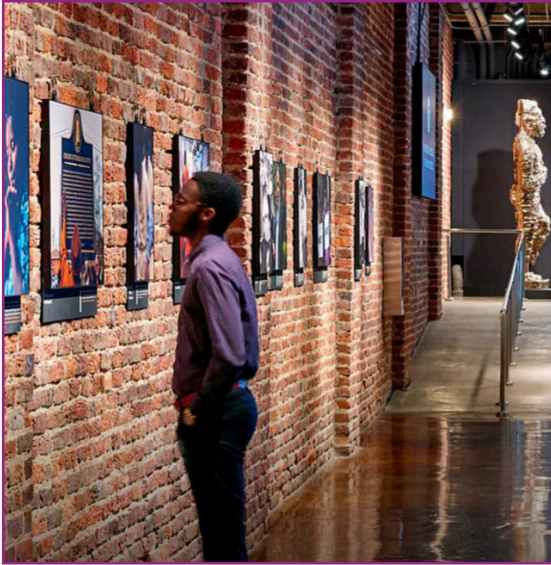
