### Guest Lecturer on *Thoughts and Prayers* Trumpet Piece for Gun Violence

**TODAY in the Nave**, Stacy Simpson will lecture with composer Roy Magnus on a trumpet piece for gun violence, "Thoughts and Prayers." Last year 48,117 lives were lost to gun violence in the United States, according to a study by researchers at the Johns Hopkins Center for Gun Violence Solutions. As gun-related deaths continue across the nation, "Thoughts and Prayers" was composed to bring awareness to gun violence. Stacy and the composer will discuss the intricacies of the composition. This will take place following the service and coffee hour that day.
