Christ Church Cathedral welcomes the Rev. Dr. David Carletta

Next Sunday we will host guest celebrant and preacher the Rev. Dr. David Carletta. Fr. Carletta serves as the Rector of Trinity Episcopal Church, Owensboro. Fr. David is originally from Rochester, New York. He holds a master's degree in International Affairs from Ohio University and a doctorate in Latin American & Caribbean history from Michigan State University. He received his Master in Divinity from the General Theological Seminary and was ordained to the priesthood in 2010 at Grace Church in Newark, New Jersey by the Rt. Rev. Wendell Gibbs. Before coming to Kentucky, Fr. David served parishes in the Episcopal Diocese of New York and the Episcopal Diocese of West Tennessee.

While Fr. David is at the Cathedral, Dean Matt will be celebrating and preaching at Trinity, Owensboro. We hope that this sharing in worship and exchange of clergy will help foster a deeper relationship between our congregations as a part of our Cathedral's ministry of connection in the Diocese of Kentucky.

Next Sunday, June 2, is the date of our monthly Community Breakfast. Each month we serve a delicious hot breakfast to around 100 of our neighbors from the downtown community. We are in particular need of volunteers to wait tables this month. Servers arrive between 8:00-8:15 to receive instructions and wait tables from 8:30-9:30. We will also be gathering our congregation's donations for the food pantry at Calvary Episcopal Church. The pantry serves neighbors from throughout the city, and especially those who come to Central Louisville Community Ministries, of which the Cathedral is a member congregation. Since March of 202 the pantry has served 80,236 people from our community. This past week was their busiest yet, with 380 clients served. The pantry is always in need of shelf stable food items like pasta and pasta sauce, canned meat, and cereal.
