# Christ Church Cathedral to bless candles, throats today for Candlemas

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation, also known as Candlemas. It has long been the custom of Christians to bring candles from their homes to their churches to have them blessed on this occasion when we commemorate the Presentation of Jesus, the Light of the World. If you would like to have a candle or candles blessed, please bring them with you to the narthex next Sunday for the blessing, which will take place prior to the opening procession.

We will also be offering a blessing of throats as an anticipatory commemoration of St. Blaise. The custom arises from a story of how the imprisoned Saint used a pair of crossed candles to bless the throat of a choking boy, miraculously curing him. We will use a pair of candles (unlit) to bless the throats of any who would like to participate in the narthex following Sunday worship.

## **Cathedral's Annual Meeting**

The Annual meeting of the congregation of Christ Church was held this past Sunday, January 26th in Bishops' Hall following worship today. # Dr. James Rightmyer to serve as Cathedral's Interim Music Director and Organist

It is our pleasure to announce that Dr. Jim Rightmyer has agreed to serve as the Interim Music Director and Organist for Christ Church Cathedral. Dr. Rightmyer received his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Most recently, he served as the Music Director and Organist of St. Francis in the Fields Episcopal Church in Harrods Creek, KY for over 40 years. Dr. Rightmyer began his work as our Interim Music Director and Organist at the choir rehearsal this past Wednesday, January 29. We are grateful to Dr. Rightmyer for accepting this call to serve at the Cathedral and are excited for him to become a part of the Cathedral community for this interim period.

#### Make a difference at Room in the Inn:

We have completed our first month of Room in the Inn, thanks in large part to your hard work and generosity.



The planning team has continued to incorporate feedback from guests, volunteers, and UP to make for a

smoother experience for everyone involved.

We are still in need of additional volunteers overnight on the evening of February 25 into the morning of February 26. You can make a difference in the lives of our neighbors who would not otherwise have a place to go by being a host on the night listed above.

Here is a brief description of what volunteers will be doing as a part of this ministry. Each night is broken up into three shifts: Welcome, Overnight, and Breakfast.

The Welcome shift (5:00-10:00 PM) will prepare for, welcome, and check-in guests from the guest list provided by UP. Guests arrive at 6 PM. After all the guests arrive, those who have volunteered to provide dinner will share and serve a family-style dinner and conversation with the guests between 6:00 and 7:00 pm, and help with clean-up after the meal. Volunteers

to provide dinner are needed. Please sign up to provide a meal for guests and staff on the sign up sheets across from the Office. After dinner is over, guests will have time to watch a movie or television, play a card game, which we'll have available on site, or if they want to, go ahead and turn in for the evening.

The Overnight volunteers will arrive at 9:45 PM, 15 minutes prior to the end of the welcome shift, to allow for check in time between the two teams of volunteers. We require that at least one woman be a part of each overnight shift, as this is a requirement of our insurance provider. Lights will be turned out at 10:00 PM. Overnight volunteers are allowed to sleep in shifts, so no one must be awake for the entire night. The shift ends at 5:00 AM.

The breakfast shift volunteers arrive at 5:00 AM. Lights are turned on and the two volunteer teams check in about how the overnight shift went. The breakfast shift serves the guests breakfast, and helps them get their belongings together, clean up their spaces, and exit the shelter by 6:30 AM. Once all guests have exited the shelter, breakfast volunteers clean up the shelter space, wash dishes that were used over the course of the evening and morning, and make sure that everything is ready to go the next night. You should be able to wrap up not later than 7:30 AM

We're getting close to filling up our nights, so please take a look at the schedule and see if you might be able to help close out those commitments. If you have any questions about how you can get involved in Room in the Inn, please contact one of the Room in the Inn planning team members

## **Community Breakfast Annual Report 2024**

In 2024, approximately the 16th year of this ministry, we continued with our personal service to our guests at their tables, rather than serving in the steam table line. Our guests, and many of our servers, have commented how much they like it. It requires a few more volunteers (and we will always welcome new volunteers!!!) but we appreciate being able to serve our neighbors in this way. Attendance at the Breakfasts increased substantially during the year and we served about 1,250 breakfasts to an average of 70-75 guests each month. In January 2024, we served about 118 breakfasts and in November 2024, we served our high of about 130 breakfasts. The first twenty to thirty minutes are hectic but our volunteer servers are wonderful and serve with poise and grace and patience!! Our cooks are the best! I continue to hear from guests, when I see them at St. John Center or at Breakfast, that this is THE best breakfast in town!!!

Our team members contributed about \$3,500 in food and supplies during the year and other members of the congregation have contributed coffee and sugar. So, the Breakfast ministry costs about \$3,800 a year, none of which comes from the Cathedral budget.

I personally LOVE this ministry and am so very grateful to the Cathedral for sustaining it and for all the volunteers and contributors who make it possible!
