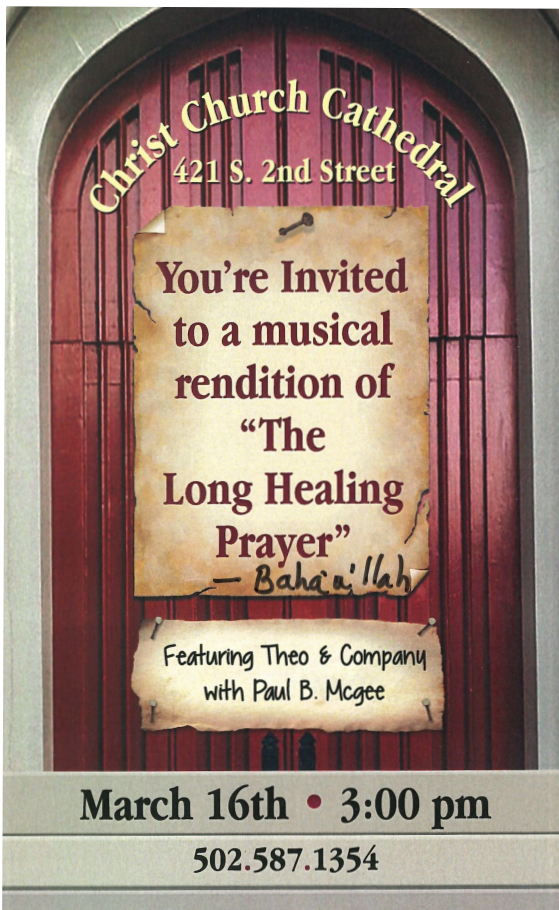

# Chapter Notes

Monthly “Chapter Notes” will detail actions and announcements occurring at the previous month’s Chapter meeting(s).

## February Meeting

Officers Elected

The following officers were elected at the regular February meeting:

## Capital Campaign

The Chapter, at its January meeting, decided to begin the application process for a one-to-one matching construction grant with a maximum of \$500,000 from the National Fund for Sacred Places. The grant funds are limited to the restoration of construction and architectural features of religious buildings with noteworthy historical features. The Chapter attended a webinar detailing the focus of the National Trust including the application process. At the subsequent specially called meeting, the Chapter approved the initiation of the application process.

The Chapter will be notified whether our application qualifies for a final comprehensive review on June 19. The final grantees are announced in early October. If the Cathedral’s grant request is accepted, the Sollog Group will continue its involvement with a modified contract through the campaign. The Chapter requests that individuals and organizations do NOT submit any pledges or funds for the Cathedral’s Capital Campaign until the formal start of the campaign. Any pledges or funds received before the announcement of the final National Fund grantees CANNOT be counted as funds for the matching grant.

## Personnel Searches

- Associate Dean: The search for an Associate Dean will begin in March with the position focused on evangelism and outreach. The initial funding for the position is through a Diocesan five-year grant with decreasing annual funding.
- Director of Music/Organist: The search for this position is focused on a single person meeting the requirements of both positions. However, if a single person cannot serve in both functions, the search will be expanded to two individuals.

## Property Issues

- Chiller Replacement: The malfunctioning chiller has been replaced, and its performance testing will be completed when the ambient temperature exceeds 60 degrees.
- Deans’ Hall Plumbing Problem: The major plumbing problem occurring in the sewer outflow from Deans’ Hall was caused by a water line that had been misplaced through the sewer line at the time of the last renovation. This problem was resolved on February 21. The site of the obstruction is outside the Cathedral’s area of financial responsibility.
- Link Building Carpeting: The carpeting on the first floor of the Link building was replaced up to the landing on February 19. Thanks to an anonymous donor for funding this needed project.
