The Kohler Family Scholarship Committee meets bi-annually to review applications for students requesting financial assistance to attend college, university or vocational programs. Applicants must be baptized and be a member of a church in the Episcopal Diocese of Kentucky. The applicant must show financial need, academic promise, be baptized, and be willing to provide additional supporting information as stipulated on the Application. Scholarships are available once a semester. Applications are accepted up to June 15th for fall semesters, and up to November 1st for spring semesters. Quarterly Financial Report to the Parish

In continuation by the Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson and the Finance Committee to provide an up-to-date financial status of Christ Church Cathedral to the parish, this report covers the first quarter of 2025. The final pledge amount for 2025 is approximately the same amount as the 2024 pledges.

Regarding revenues for the first quarter, the receipts from pledging givers were significantly above the projected budget amount. Also, donations from non-pledging givers exceeded the projected budgeted estimates. Direct payments to the Cathedral through online giving continues its success. Access for online giving is at <http://ccclou.org> and through its "Donate" portal. This direct donation approach is available for single, monthly, and recurring contributions.

Regarding all expenses for the quarter, most expense items were either below or slightly above the year-to-date budget. However, over-budget expenses in music activities are due to the transitions in the positions of Music Director and Organist. Several areas of repairs and other building expenses cause overages from quarterly expectations. Finally, LG&E increased costs have resulted from both the January and February weather and the two months of Room in the Inn activities.

During the first quarter of 2024, the Cathedral has applied to the U.S. Federal Government for reimbursement under the Employment Retention Credit Act for costs of retention of employees during the Covid pandemic. Notification of the federal decision regarding the application continues to be pending.

In summary, the financial position of Christ Church Cathedral is stable and favorable for the future.

In July, as standard practice, the Finance Committee will perform an in-depth revision regarding revenues and all expenses based on the experience of the first six months of 2025 and up-to-date projections for the final six months.

The Treasurer and Finance Committee express great appreciation for timely monthly contributions, either through Sunday collections, direct deposits, or mailed personal checks, to address the Cathedral's monthly expenses.

If you have any questions, please contact Kay Shields Wilkinson or John Kiesel, chair of the Finance Committee. Other Finance Committee members are Dean Matt Bradley, Austin Cooper, Susan Torok, Jerry Brown, and Vance Fritton. The Finance Committee operates under the aegis of the Chapter and each Financial Committee member receives monthly in-depth financial reports.
