Christ Church Christ to hold Sacred Ground Circle this summer

This summer Christ Church Cathedral will hold a weekly Sacred Ground Circle beginning Wednesday, June 18 at 6:00 PM in Deans Hall. Sessions will last two hours and will include a light supper.

Sacred Ground is a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith. Participants in the Circle will walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity.

The 11-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories.

Sacred Ground is part of Becoming Beloved Community, The Episcopal Church's long-term commitment to racial healing, reconciliation, and justice in our personal lives, our ministries, and our society. This series is open to all, and especially designed to help white people talk with other white people. Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

Chapter Notes • April 2025

Monthly "Chapter Notes" will detail actions and announcements occurring at the previous month's Chapter meeting(s).

Chapter Retreat

The Chapter will hold its annual retreat on June 6 and 7 at the Diocesan All Saints' Camp. The primary focus of the retreat will be organizational approach to the strategic planning for CCC for the next three years. Topics under consideration will include the capital campaign, continuation of Room in the Inn-Louisville, activities to reach out to the community, parking, and possibly others. As a strategic endeavor, all articulated goals will entail benchmarks and prioritization.

The secondary topic for discussion is the determination of the use/designation of the \$10,000 unrestricted gift received from Mr. Macauley Lord, descendant of the Rev. James Craik, pastor of CCC before, during, and after the Civil War.

Property Issues

Steam Table: The Chapter authorized the repair of the hot-water reservoir of the 20-year-old steam table with the cost of \$900.

Newcomers Committee

The Newcomers Committee's initial meeting was scheduled within a week of the April Chapter meeting. Any parish member wishing to participate on this committee should contact Graham Whatley at gwhatley1206@gmail.com.

Safety Committee

The Safety Committee has submitted its draft "Safety and Security Plan" to the Chapter and received comments. The Committee will review those comments and any further comments for completion of the final document for acceptance by the Chapter.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson provided an overview of March's Financial Reports. [An overview of the first quarter's Financial Reports was published in the last two issues of "Parish Notes" in April.] She noted the unrestricted gift of \$10,000 as described above. Also, Kay reported on the in-progress conversion of payment for routine bills from single checks to the "Auto Pay" automatic debit system with PNC Bank.

Marmion Loan Repayment

For the purchase and installation of the chiller system in 2024, CCC obtained funding through a Marmion Loan. Presently, the loan is being repaid through monthly amortized payments. The Chapter requested the Finance Committee to evaluate various options to address the repayment of the loan and forward to the Chapter its considerations and possible recommendations.

Woodcock Foundation Scholarship

Dean Bradley announced that the Woodcock Foundation Scholarship Program has designated \$1,500 per parish for support to students in college or post-high school educational programs. CCC is now seeking candidates for the 2025 fall semester.

Church Growth Conference

Dean Bradley noted that St. Francis in the Fields is conducting a conference titled "Tending the Vineyard: A Conference on Church Growth and Decline" on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday June 5, 6, and 7, 2025. Cost per person is \$85-\$135. Information on schedule of talks and registration is available through St. Francis in the Fields' website (stfrancisinthefields.org) – Events – dates June 5 through 7. Any interested parishioner is invited to attend.
