May 2025 Meeting

Chapter Retreat:

This year's Chapter Retreat, originally scheduled for June 6 and 7 at the Diocesan All Saints' Center, was changed to Friday, July 11 and Saturday, July 12, to accommodate the schedule of the desired facilitator.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson reported on the status of the conversion of routine disbursements from routine checks to automatic withdrawal payments.

Woodcock Foundation Scholarship:

Three potential scholarship recipients to share Christ Church Cathedral's \$1,500 allocation were

identified for the fall semester. The formal announcement of the individuals will occur when qualifications are confirmed.

Property Issues:

Steam Table: The repairs of the hot water reservoir are pending. Electrical Outlets: The Chapter authorized the installation of two sets of outlets on the back wall of the Sacristy.

Church Growth Conference:

Dean Bradley again noted that St. Francis in the Fields is conducting a conference titled "Tending the Vineyard: A Conference on Church Growth and Decline" on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, June 5, 6, and 7. Cost per person is \$85-\$135. Information on the schedule of talks and registration is available through St. Francis in the Fields' website (stfrancisinthefields.org) – Events – dates June 5 through 7. Any interested parishioner may attend.

Surgery Center Gate Key Policy:

Several partner groups (e.g., UP) have requested copies of the gate key to the surgical center parking lot. John Werst agreed to write a policy addressing the issue.

Church Property Environmental Issues:

Dean Matt identified increasing problems occurring on CCC grounds and immediate surrounding areas: the overnight accumulation of trash and other waste on the Second Street sidewalk/Cathedral steps, as well as in the rear parking lot and alley. It takes an average of thirty minutes to an hour each day, including Sundays, to remove the refuse and hose down the entrances. Dean Matt requested that Chapter members brainstorm methods and strategies to resolve these problems.

Author's forum and book discussion of *Bound By an Oath* next Sunday, June 8

Christ Church Cathedral is pleased to welcome local author and Episcopal priest the Rev. Anne Marie Harris for an author's forum and discussion of her debut novel, *Bound By an Oath*, on Pentecost Sunday, June 8 at 12 noon.

It is 462 AD, and the monk, Fra Paulos, is reminiscing on his long life. And what a life! Sent many years earlier to find the Pope's brother, who had stayed in the land of the Britons after the last Romans had left, Paulos braves the sea journey only to find that the legacy left by the Romans is beginning to wane in the face of resurfacing druid beliefs. However, there are some Christians doing good work, and Paulos needs to stand firm against the hatred leveled towards all Romans. Then he meets Aethelreda, Queen of the Cantii, and for Paulos, life is about to change forever.

Tickets and Parking are Still Available for Racing Louisville's Pride Game on June 6

If you plan to attend the LGBTQIA+-affirming churches group which will be at Racing Louisville FC's Pride-themed game this coming Friday, June 6th, tickets for the game and parking are still available. There is ample street parking available on Cabel and E. Washington near the stadium. However, for those who want to park closer, below is a link to purchase parking lot access. Parking is not cheap, but it is controlled by the stadium authority not Racing, so we have not been offered a deal on parking.

PARKING and Tickets Link

If anyone has a handicap placard, they can show it to the lot attendant upon entry and will be directed to the designated accessible parking area. Here's a quick breakdown of the lots:

- GRAY Lot Closest to where we'll be sitting
- PURPLE Lot Generally considered the best parking option overall
- GOLD Lot Requires using stairs, so it's not recommended for anyone with mobility concerns

Christ Church Christ to hold Sacred Ground Circle this summer

This summer Christ Church Cathedral will hold a weekly Sacred Ground Circle beginning Wednesday, June 18 at 6:00 PM in Deans Hall. Sessions will last two hours and will include a light supper.

Sacred Ground is a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith. Participants in the Circle will walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity.

The 11-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories.

Sacred Ground is part of Becoming Beloved Community, The Episcopal Church's long-term commitment to racial healing, reconciliation, and justice in our personal lives, our ministries, and our society. This series is open to all, and especially designed to help white people talk with other white people. Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

Our successes this year include a public commitment from Mayor Greenberg to implement the reforms mandated in the LMPD Consent Decree even if it is not approved by the federal court.

The expertise and hard work of our two full-time professional community organizers guide our nearly 400 unpaid volunteers in achieving results like this. Our financial investments support them, pay for the Nehemiah Action venue, office expenses, and provide leadership training for the Team Leaders in each of our 24 member congregations.
