



This year on July 22nd, we celebrate the 51th anniversary of the ordination of a group of women deacons in the Episcopal Church who, in 1974, not only organized, but found sympathetic Bishops within the Episcopal Church to help them, and were ordained as Priests by those Bishops, though their ordinations were considered outside the Canons of the Episcopal Church, which did not allow the ordination of women. This documentary film presents their journey.
