Summer Songwriter Series Continues



Save The Date! July 22 The Cathedral will share a public Screening *The Philadelphia 11*

This year on Tuesday, July 29, we celebrate the 51th anniversary of the ordination of a group of women deacons in the Episcopal Church who, in 1974, not only organized, but found sympathetic Bishops within the Episcopal Church to help them, and were ordained as Priests by those Bishops, though their ordinations were considered outside the Canons of the Episcopal Church, which did not allow the ordination of women. This documentary film presents their journey.

Christ Church Cathedral is pleased to host a Screening of The Philadelphia 11 on **Tuesday**, **July 22**. Doors open at 6:00 PM and the screening begins at 6:30 PM.

The Rev. Dr. Carter Heyward, ordained that historic day, will join us by Zoom for discussion, followed by a question-and-answer session after the 90 minute screening. Admission is free and the screening is open to the public.

Chapter Notes: June 2025

Monthly "Chapter Notes" provide an unofficial summary of the month's Chapter meeting(s). Official Minutes are posted on the bulletin board by the parish office once they have been approved by the Chapter.

Capital Campaign

Christ Church Cathedral received from the National Fund for Sacred Places (NSFP) the invitation to advance to the second phase of our grant application. Historically, this fund receives more than 400 applications annually and invites 40 to 50 of those initial applicants to enter the second phase. Dean Matt will meet with staff from NFSP at the Cathedral on Monday, June 30, with a follow-up meeting with Nick Sollog of the Sollog Group, our capital campaign consultant, on July 2. In addition, local research has identified four large local funding organizations whose areas of grants appear compatible with the Cathedral's funding needs.

Music Director Search

One candidate for the position of Music Director provided an audition including a rehearsal with the choir on June 25. The target date for the start of that position is mid-August.

Chapter Retreat

This year's Chapter Retreat is scheduled for July 11 and 12 at the Diocesan All Saints' Camp. The Chapter has engaged Eric Schmall to facilitate the in-depth discussions on the development of a strategic plan for the next three years of the Cathedral's ministry.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson reported on the status of the conversion of routine disbursements from checks to automatic withdrawal payments for all utilities, church pension fund, insurance, and other established monthly fees. She announced that all churchwide billings will be paperless by October 2025.

Kay announced the formal internal annual audit will be performed with the exchange of the audit team of St. Mark's Church during the summer.

Property Issues

The committee involved with building and grounds met this week, addressing the expenses to date and the status of those activities with the annual budget.

Surgery Center Gate Key Policy

John Werst agreed to write a policy addressing requests from outside groups who use CCC frequently at night for the issuance of keys to the Surgery Center parking lot.

Church Property Environmental Issues

Since last month's Chapter meeting, several developments to address the multiple environmental issues on and around the church property have been initiated:

- A new group organized by Metro Louisville called "Downtown Community Ambassadors" will be involved in monitoring and cleaning trash from our entire block, generally on a daily basis.
- Dean Matt has engaged a local downtown resident to monitor activities of unhoused individuals and to clean areas several days a week.

July Chapter Meeting

The Chapter will not meet in July except for its scheduled retreat. The next regular Chapter meeting will be August 21, 2025.
