Christ Church Cathedral Welcomes Fr. Charles Myers

The Rev Fr Charles T. Myers is a native of Florida but has lived in Chicago, Los Angeles and returned to Florida. He graduated from Stetson University with a Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies and a Master of Divinity from Northern Seminary with an emphasis in Worship in the Urban Context and has been ordained as a priest in the Anglican/Episcopal Tradition for



eighteen years. Prior to answering the call to be the Associate Dean and Missioner for Outreach and Evangelism at Christ Church Cathedral, Fr Charles served as pastor of The Episcopal Church of St John the Baptist in Orlando FL, an African American Church that is rooted in Civil Rights and committed to Community Rights. He also ministered with the poor, the homeless, and recovering addicts on Skid Row in Los Angeles, California planting Eucharistic Communities and serving Churches in cross-cultural contexts.

Fr Charles has partnered with community organizations and nonprofits on issues of housing, immigration, mental health, HIV testing, and fair wages. He has spoken to the powers that be through engagement with city, county, and state government as well as building relationships with state and local leaders.

"Archbishop Rowan Williams says that God has a Mission and that Mission has a Church. Like the Apostle Paul in Romans 15:16, my priestly vocation has always been defined as a missioner taking the Liberating Word of the Gospel and the richness of our Episcopal Tradition to the streets among marginalized, ostracized, the poor, and the broken. I see this same vision being expressed here at Christ Church Cathedral and I invite those who are inspired by the Spirit to join us in this journey!"

Fr Charles, his wife Monique, and son Moses are grateful to the Triune God to minister with Christ Church Cathedral in the beautiful city of Louisville, and his family will be coming to join him near the end of December. Please give them a warm welcome when you see them!

Chapter Notes • November 20, 2025 Capital Campaign

Dean Matt Bradley reported that the National Fund for Sacred Places (NFSP) has awarded a \$500,000 one-to-one matching grant for our Capital Campaign. Dean Bradley, Lee Cochran, and Jan Margerum attended a three-day meeting with other grantees and NFSP officials to become oriented with procedures and processes applicable to this grant. In addition, NFSP provides a supplemental \$20,000 planning grant for establishment of fund-raising activities. NFSP also provides technical and architectural consultants, as well as a dedicated contact person for the duration of the grant.

The next step is for the capital campaign team to meet with our consultant and update our campaign plan and timeline in light of the new information we have received. The congregation will receive a full presentation on our new plans at the annual meeting in January.

Associate Dean Search

Dean Bradley previously announced to the parish that Father Charles Myers of Orlando, Florida, has accepted our call to fill the Associate Dean position. He will arrive in town during the week of November 24 and will be present at the Sunday service on November 30.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson informed the Chapter that the Cathedral was in a good financial position at the end of October. Regarding the preliminary budget development, she noted that many pledges have been received; however, fifteen households which pledged last year have not yet submitted pledges for 20226. Chapter members will contact each of these pledging households prior to the December Chapter meeting.

Speaker System Update

The Cathedral has received the quotes for the purchase and installation of the speakers and the electrical work for the wiring component. Dean Bradley will contact individuals who have expressed an interest in contributing to this work and report back to the Chapter.

Property Issues

John Werst reported that the grilles on two air return vents located in the west area of the Nave are in need of removal and cleaning. The Chapter authorized that maintenance.

Room in the Inn Louisville

Dean Matt announced that overnight services for unhoused women and their minor children will begin January 5, 2026. The Chapter decided for parish members to staff the Cathedral site on the opening night (January 5) and commit to staff at least one night per week during the duration of the program.

Safety Plans and Procedures

Tara Durnil presented the complete Safety Plans and Procedures for review and acceptance. Several minor issues were identified for resolution. The Chapter accepted the Safety Plans and Procedures with revision.

Seasonal Employee Gifts

The annual seasonal collection to recognize all non-clergy employees for their service to the clergy and Cathedral will begin on Sunday, November 30, and conclude at the service Christmas morning. Contributions can be submitted either in the offering plates or by mail.

Development of Strategies Identified at the Retreat

At its July Retreat, the Chapter identified six areas of specific strategies for action by Chapter members. These six areas are Membership Growth, Staff Growth, Successful Capital Campaign, Chapter-Led Volunteer Committees/Structure, Growth in Electronic/Virtual Presence, and Financial Growth to Support These Goals. All Chapter members were equally distributed

among these working groups, and each group has begun its activities with four of the six groups providing their initial reports.



Capital Campaign Update

Nov. 17-19, Dean Matt, Jan Margerum (representing the Capital Campaign Committee), and Lee Cochran (representing the Building Assessment Committee) attended the National Fund for Sacred Places (NFSP) recipient training in Philadelphia to prepare to meet the requirements of the Cathedral's \$500,000 matching grant.

Matt and members of the Building Assessment committee will be meeting with Senler Campbell Engineering and General Restoration (the general contractor) before the end of 2025 to review their reports on needed and prioritized restoration projects and to discuss repair timelines.

As part of the National Fund grant, on Jan. 6, 2026, there will be an intake call with the Cathedral's assigned NFSP representative, who will be working with us over the next two years. This will begin quarterly check-ins on our progress with fundraising and slated repairs. Before the end of 2025, we will be meeting with our Capital Campaign consultant, Nick Sollog of the Sollog Group, to discuss planning and implementation of the Solicitation Phase of our campaign. Per the NFSP grant requisites, any campaign monies pledged or collected after Oct. 21, 2025, will

count toward our required match of \$500,000. During the Sunday, January 25, 2026 Annual Meeting, there will be a Town Hall-style update about the NFSP matching Grant.

Thank you for your patience over the past two years as behind-the-scenes work has taken place to assess buildings, prioritize repair projects, and to research grant opportunities. We are thankful to be a recipient of the National Fund for Scared Places Grant. The Cathedral is one the 312 2025 applicants, 40 semi-finalists, and 30 cohort/recipients of their grants – and the first recipient in the state of Kentucky in their 10-year history! Onward we go, with enthusiasm for the Cathedral's future in ministry, service, and evangelism. Thanks be to God.
