Chapter Notes

December 18, 2025

Capital Campaign

Dean Matt Bradley reported that the present focus is finalizing the leadership team of the capital campaign committee and gathering of all construction documents for submission to the National Fund for Sacred Place for their approval. The solicitation phase of the capital campaign will launch later in the first quarter of 2026. This will begin with the advance gifts phase followed by a kickoff event for the congregational gifts phase of the campaign.

Associate Dean Position

Dean Bradley introduced Father Charles Myers to the Chapter. He came on staff on November 30 and will be active in community outreach and evangelism. The search for his funding sources, after the Diocesan grant starts its incremental grant reduction in two years, will begin with the January 2026 Chapter meeting.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson reported on November's Financial Statements: Regarding Revenues, pledging givers are above the projected budget amount, while the non-pledging receipts are below their projections. Expenses are generally in-line with the budget with a larger insurance premium for the month due to the contract year beginning in November requiring a larger amount for that Month. The end-of-month cash position was significantly above the projected budget amount.

2026 Budget

The Treasurer's report on the budget also specified areas of further development including reviewing areas of expenses which could be reduced. Also, areas of additional revenue were identified for placement in the budget (Hast fund, Diocesan Forward Fund Grant, and Community Fund grant, potential pledges from individuals/pairs who have pledged in the past). The Treasurer presented a balanced budget with consideration for additional outstanding Pledges.

Property Issues

John Werst reported the following activities: Air intakes in the Nave were cleaned. The BDry system in the basement of Diocesan House was extended to cover UP's offices. Drywall replacement necessitated by the project are pending. LED fixture replacements in the UP area in the lower level of Diocesan House were completed. A toilet in one of the bathrooms in the Narthex was replaced. He indicated the following pending projects: Replacing/adding parking signs in the church parking area LED upgrades on the second and third floors of Diocesan House.

Room in the Inn Louisville

Dean Bradley announced that the Louisville-Metro Council has enacted an ordinance requiring all overnight shelters, like Room in the Inn Louisville, be designated "Accessory Overnight Shelters" and be licensed. An extensive licensing process was detailed in the Ordinance. Both RITI shelters submitted their applications on December 18. Due to complexities in the licensing process, no children will be served this year. Dean Bradley further noted that volunteer churches have signed up for all but four dates for the month of January.

Chapter Membership Nominating Committee

Dean Bradley noted that the Chapter Nominating Committee will be comprised of those members who are ending their term: Tara Durnil, George Hubbard, and Louise Isaacs. Dean Bradley will also serve on this committee.

Deans' Matters

The Chapter, by resolution, authorized a portion of each Deans' income be designated "housing

allowance" in agreement with appropriate tax requirements. The Chapter authorized the addition of Father Charles Myers as a signatory for the "Dean's Discretionary Fund."
