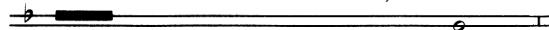

Gospel Matthew 2:13-15,19-23

The Holy Gospel of our Savior, Jesus Christ, according to Matthew.

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

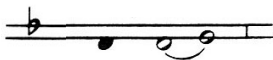
**We remember Christ's death,

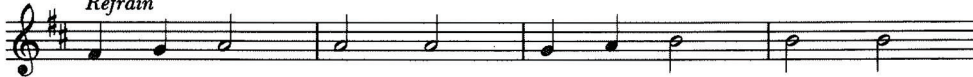

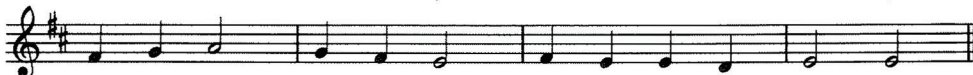
