A celebration of and thanksgiving for the Ministry of St. Thomas Episcopal Church over the years will be held in April at St. Thomas Episcopal Church, 9600 Westport Road, Louisville, KY 4024. Join them on Saturday, April 18th at 11AM. St. Thomas was first established in Lyndon in 1908, becoming a mission church of the Diocese in 1947 and moving into its current Westport Road location in 1968. Over the years, St. Thomas worked to maintain community and diocesan ties. It supported and worked with Zachary Taylor Elementary School, and its participation in the Read To Grow program was well attended and a wonderful outreach program for the children of that school. St. Thomas also made space available to a number of local neighborhood groups, supporting those community enriching activities and utilizing their space.

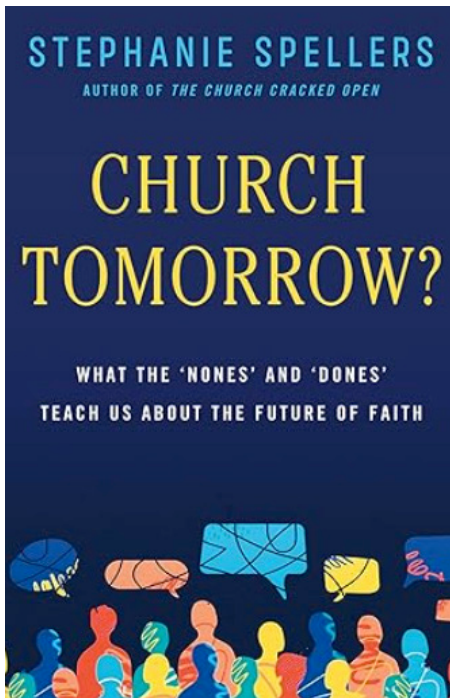
match. If you're looking to spend less, the Gold lot is the cheapest option, just know that it involves a bit more of a walk and navigating some stairs on the way in.

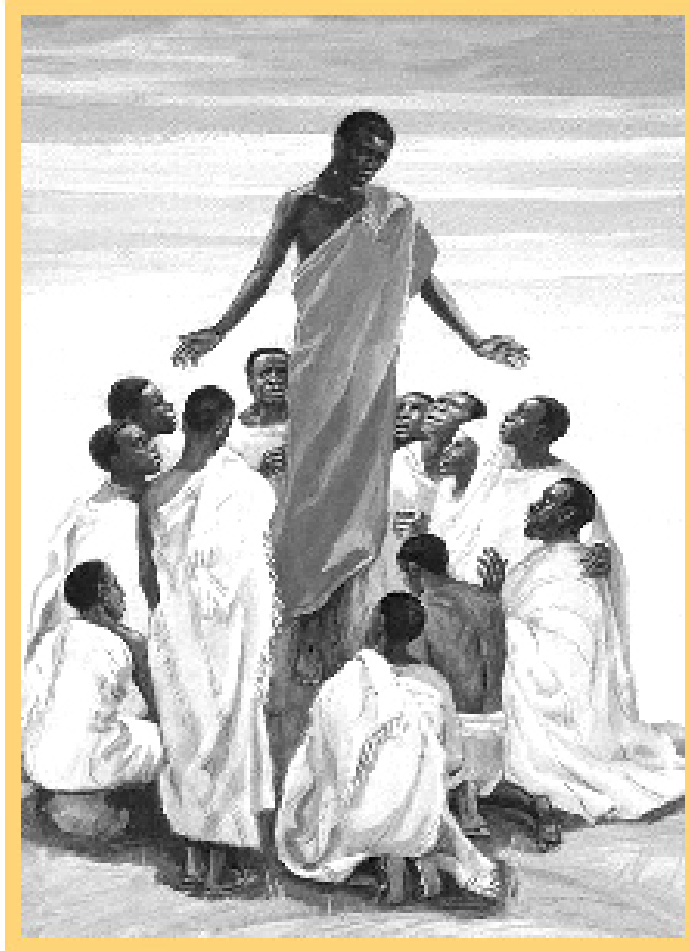
### Weekly Bible Study
