Wear red for Pentecost

Next Sunday, May 24, is the Feast of Pentecost. This is the day on which we celebrate the coming of the promised gift of the Holy Spirit which descended upon the disciples as tongues of fire. Wear red next week as a symbol of the Spirit's flame, which is imparted to each of us, as we pray for a fresh outpouring of the Spirit to empower our witness to Christ's love in our Cathedral community and the world.

Laying on of Hands for healing to be offered during Sunday worship

Healing was at the center of Jesus' ministry and laying on of hands for healing has been part of the life of the church since New Testament times. The Apostle Paul includes healing among the gifts of the Holy Spirit exercised in the worship of Christ's body, the church. On Sunday, May 24, the Day of Pentecost, clergy experienced in this ministry will be in the narthex to offer a personal prayer for healing along with laying on of hands and anointing. Those who opt for this ministry are encouraged to come to the narthex before returning to their seats after receiving communion.

Make your reservation for our All Saints fellowship weekend



The Cathedral will be holding a parish fellowship weekend at All Saints Friday, June 12-Sunday, June 14. The weekend begins with check-in at 5 PM (all times Central) on Friday and concludes at noon on Sunday, following Holy Eucharist. Our time together will be largely unstructured, focusing on creating opportunities for worship, recreation, and getting to know each other.

Amenities at All Saints include a pool, canoes, kayaks, disc golf, a driving range, hiking, and more. Wifi is available in the lodge and inn. Those attending are also welcome to bring activities to share with others, such as board games, puzzles, crafts, or whatever gives you joy. Rooms for the retreat are \$160 for the weekend, with both single and shared rooms available. That price is per room, not per person, so sharing a room will reduce the cost per person. 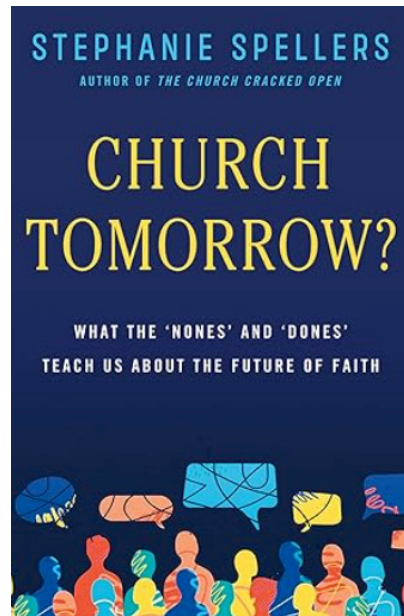

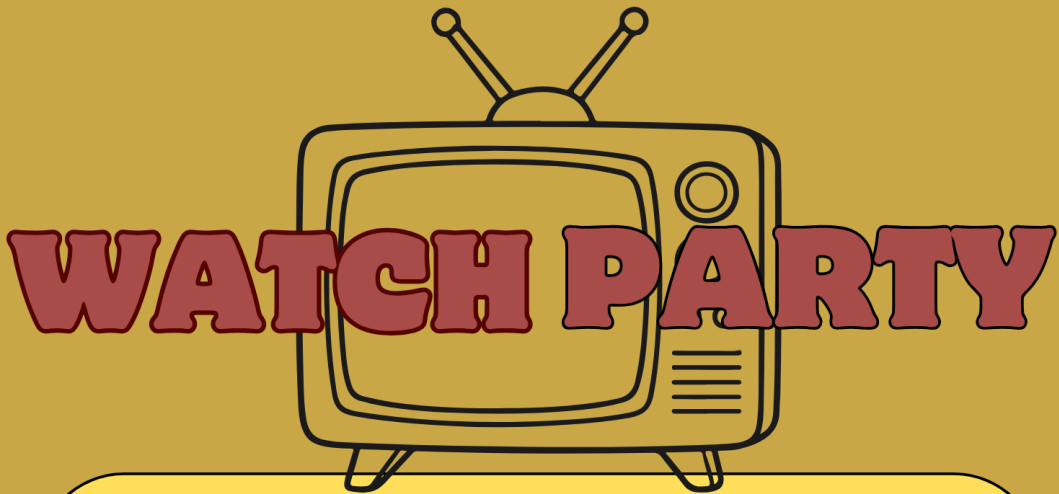
Racing Louisville FC's Tickets, Parking, and T-Shirts for The Pride Game Night on May 29, 8 pm

Time is drawing near! Mark your calendars and select your seats using the Ticket link below! Once again, LGBTQIA+ Affirming Louisville area Churches will gather for an evening outing to watch Racing Louisville Footclub for a Pride Game at Lynn Family Stadium. In Addition to the Ticket Link, there will soon be a link for ordering Pride Night T-Shirts, as we did last year. That link will be posted as soon as it is available to us. The group will have a section of seats held for us, so that all the Church communities are sitting together. You will be able to select seats from within that group section. There is paid parking at the stadium. If being close to the stadium matters, the Gray and Purple lots are the ones to review. Purple is the higher-priced option. I park in Gray myself. It's a really solid middle ground, close enough to be convenient and easy to get in and out after the match. If you're looking to spend less, the Gold lot is the cheapest option, just know that it involves a bit more of a walk and navigating some stairs on the way in.

The simplest way to handle all of this is to go straight through Scott Servetnick, the ticket rep helping us with this event. He can line up parking with your tickets and make sure you get what you need without any hassle.
