The Cathedral will be holding a parish fellowship weekend at All Saints Friday, June 12-Sunday, June 14. The weekend begins with check-in at 5 PM (all times Central) on Friday and concludes at noon on Sunday, following Holy Eucharist. Our time together will be largely unstructured, focusing on creating opportunities for worship, recreation, and getting to know each other. Amenities at All Saints include a pool, canoes, kayaks, disc golf, a driving range, hiking, and more. Wifi is available in the lodge and inn. There is still time! Mark your calendars and select your seats using the Ticket link below! An Amazon Prime NWSL Broadcast Team will join the Pride Night LBGTQIA+ group at TEN20 Craft Brewery, 1020 East Washington Street in Louisville at 6:30 PM, before the game, filming there. They will then film the group walking to the Stadium, and film crowd shots of the group in the stadium once the game starts. We hope you join us as LBGTQIA+ Affirming Louisville area Churches gather for an evening outing to watch Racing Louisville Footclub for a Pride Game at Lynn Family Stadium. The group will have a section of seats held for us, so that all the Church communities are sitting together. You will be able to select seats from within that group section. There is paid parking at the stadium. If being close to the stadium matters, the Gray and Purple lots are the ones to review. Purple is the higher-priced option. I park in Gray myself. It's a really solid middle ground, close enough to be convenient

and easy to get in and out after the match. If you're looking to spend less, the Gold lot is the cheapest option, just know that it involves a bit more of a walk and navigating some stairs on the way in.

The simplest way to handle all of this is to go straight through Scott Servetnick, the ticket rep helping us with this event. He can line up parking with your tickets and make sure you get what you need without any hassle.
