Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Kay Shields Wilkinson reported on May's Financial Statements, noting the excellent financial position of Christ Church Cathedral. She reported the bank's previously unrecorded interest for the Capital Campaign account is now current.

Property Issues

John Werst reported that the Diocesan House basement flooded on June 9, which required the shop-vac removal of approximately 175-200 gallons of rainwater. John Werst and Lee Cochran are actively involved with multiple contractors both to determine of the cause of the water entry and to remediate the water damage to carpeting in the hall and the south "day" room as well as damage to a wall with mold growth. The Chapter authorized contracts to investigate the water source, to remove the hall carpet and replace it with rubberized flooring, to remove the carpet in the south "day" room, and to repair the wall.

Wireless Microphone System

Father Charles Myers has received his personal wireless microphone, and the entire system underwent adjustments. On Sunday, June 21, Daniel Chamberlain instructed all live-stream personnel in the management of volume and other characteristics of individual microphones from the loft during a service.

Bylaws Revision

At its May meeting, the Chapter received draft recommendations for the Bylaws revisions by Graham Whatley. A committee will be formed of Chapter members and external individuals to complete this project by Dean Bradley's return in September.

Annual Stewardship Campaign

The Senior Warden requested Chapter members to assist in recruiting several parish members to serve in this ministry.

Central Louisville Community Ministries

Ms. Lynette Lowe, CLCM CEO, presented to the Chapter the variety and volume of many CLCM 2025-26 activities: housing assistance (273 families), LG&E assistance (530 families), water assistance (67 families), bags of food (35,000), personal care packages (1,110), TARC passes (420), haircut vouchers (251), and bicycles (88). To achieve these objectives, CLCM's cash budget is approximately \$400,000. She reported that the demand for their services is rapidly expanding, including new socio-economic groups. Ms. Lowe requested the Cathedral to consider increasing its annual contribution. Her request will be considered for the 2027 budget.

Ms. Lowe will submit an article to the "Parish Notes" regarding CLCM activities with a request for personal contributions from parishioners.

Central Louisville Community Ministries: a Half-Century of Partnership

Central Louisville Community Ministries (CLCM) and Christ Church Cathedral have partnered for more than 50 years in assisting our central Louisville neighbors with meeting basic needs. We at CLCM are very grateful for Christ Church's commitment to CLCM through its Board membership, an annual church financial pledge, active volunteers, and many generous individual donations from congregants. This fiscal year, we have provided record amounts of assistance to our neighbors who are coming to us in increasing numbers and with much larger needs. CLCM has kept LG&E turned on for 551 families with

\$115,750 in funding, kept the water flowing for 69 families with \$13,600, kept 482 individuals safely housed with \$96,200 in rent/mortgage assistance, provided 1126 personal care packages, 7046 items of clothing, 255 haircut vouchers, 427 TARC passes, and 90 bikes to help stabilize our neighbors.

In addition, we provide case management to those who request additional help overcoming barriers to stability, free legal advice, prescription assistance, school supplies, winter coats and accessories, Thanksgiving hams and turkeys, and much more. Our coffee ministry welcomes all for a free hot cup of coffee each morning, and our staff and volunteers offer the ministry of deep listening.



All of this is only possible through our funders' and donors' generosity. In this time when costs continue to rise while resources are dwindling, we ask you to consider a new or additional gift to CLCM to support our work. Every bit helps as we assist our neighbors in navigating these uncertain times. Checks can be made to CLCM, 809 S. 4th Street, 40203, and please include that you are a CCC member on the memo line. Monthly gifts help us plan across the fiscal year, and we also are grateful recipients of Required Minimum Distributions from retirement accounts, gifts from Donor Advised Funds, and planned giving.
